SMALL GROUP HOMEWORK SHEET

Series: A Season of Gratitude

Sermon Title: *Why We Can Be Grateful for God's Word in Hard Times*

Text: Psalm 119:105; 2 Timothy 3:16-17; Matthew 7:24-27

1. Review the Sermon

- What was the central truth of this message?
- Which of the three points (God's Word **guides**, **equips**, **secures**) spoke most to you personally? Why?

2. Read and Reflect

Read the following passages together:

- **Psalm 119:105** – How does God's Word act as both a lamp and a light in your daily life?
- **2 Timothy 3:16-17** – Which of the four uses of Scripture (doctrine, reproof, correction, instruction) do you most need right now?
- **Matthew 7:24-27** – What does it look like to "build your house on the rock" in practical terms?

3. Discussion Questions

- Share a time when God's Word gave you direction in a difficult situation.
- What are some "false GPS systems" (voices, influences, or instincts) that people often trust instead of God's Word?
- How can we as a group encourage one another to stay rooted in Scripture when storms come?
- In what ways can our church family show gratitude for God's Word this Thanksgiving season?

4. Personal Application

- **Daily Practice:** Commit to reading one Psalm or Proverb each day this week. Write down one way it guides, equips, or secures you.
- **Memorize:** Psalm 119:105 - *"Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path."*
- **Action Step:** Identify one area of your life where you've been relying on your own wisdom. This week, intentionally seek God's Word for direction in that area.

5. Prayer Focus

- Thank God for the gift of His Word.
- Pray for strength to obey it, not just hear it.
- Ask God to help you stand firm when storms come.
